

UKAID International Scholarship Scheme for the Ministry of Finance and Planning Tanzania

This scheme is open to people of all genders and abilities.

2018/19 September Intake

About the Scheme

This scheme offers Tanzanian graduates employed by the Ministry of Finance and Planning the opportunity to pursue relevant postgraduate education at universities in the UK. This scheme is funded by DFID Tanzania and administered by the British Council, Tanzania.

Eligibility Criteria

- a) Be a national of the United Republic of Tanzania at the time of applying and intend to return there at end of the period of study;
- b) Been an employee of the Ministry of Finance and Planning for not less than 2 years;
- c) To not be a recipient of any international scholarships/grants/benefits at the time of applying;
- d) Have an adequate standard of English language comprehension, as per the requirements of the UK Border Agency.

What does the Scheme cover?

Scholarship awards are granted for a maximum period of 12 months, for courses starting in September 2018. The awards are comprehensive, covering academic tuition fees and related administrative expenses, registration fees, field work costs, living expenses, a return airfare, pastoral care while in the UK, and support with visa applications.

- If you are interested and eligible to apply to the Scheme but have not yet submitted an application to one of the universities and for one of the courses listed above, please contact the British Council via the details listed below. The British Council will provide reasonable support to eligible candidates to submit a university application. Upon receipt of an offer for a place on a relevant course, you can then apply to the scheme.

Application deadline

The application round for 2018/19 September intake is open from 19th February 2018 and closes on 02nd March 2018.
